

FROM THE EDITOR

I was sitting in my new, overstuffed chair watching the news on our large flat screen TV in the comfort of my living room; it was then I heard the cries and screams of loved ones and friends grieving the disappearance of Malaysian Airlines Flight 370. My tears flowed freely as I witnessed the anguish of spouses, children, parents, and others. The cries of "my son, my son, my son" ignited a flame of empathy in the hearts of parents everywhere. In just a moment of time, lives were forever changed. A huge airplane with 239 passengers and crew was soaring through the skies, and suddenly, with no warning, mysteriously disappeared. As of this writing, there has been no evidence of what happened. The search has extended beyond fifty days.

More recently, I watched with millions across the world as the news media from all nations covered the sinking of the South Korean ferry boat, the Sewol,

in the Yellow Sea off the southwestern coast of the Korean Peninsula. Among the 476 on board, 339 were students and teachers from a high school in Ansan, just south of Seoul. According to reports, the captain of the ship, Lee Joon-seok, misjudged the impending tragedy and did not announce an immediate "abandon ship," but instructed everyone to remain in their rooms. Thirty minutes later he made the decision to evacuate, but it was too late for most. Today, the news reporters announced the body of the boy who made the first distress call to 119 (emergency number in S. Korea) was recovered. His message was, "Save us! We're on a ship and I think it's sinking."

For many years now, I have been interested in the term "souls" when referencing people traveling in planes and ships and as victims of tragedy. A Chicago fireman friend of mine would sometimes relate that "x number of souls perished in the fire." The term made a special impact on me. It seems as though there is not much information known on when or why the term "souls" became an accepted way of describing a person. Most references I have found trace the terminology back to sailing ships and maritime usage. The most common usage would be a question of how many "souls" are on board. Even the New York Times used the term on the front page on April 15, 1912 stating "All her boats are accounted for and about 655 souls have been saved of the crew and passengers, most of the latter presumably women and children." The sinking of the Titanic reminds us some "souls" were saved and many were lost.

I recognize I need to be careful in reading too much into the term, "souls saved," but the expression collides with my calling to evangelize lost souls with the Gospel. Evangelist Thurl Mann preached a powerful message at the Suwannee Holiness Camp Meeting several years ago in which he made the statement, "I am afraid that the Christian community has lost the awareness that lost souls are truly lost." Politically correct substitutes such as "pre-Christian" seem to take the edge off the overwhelming reality of someone losing his or her soul. I believe Jesus expressed this awareness when He said, "For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul?" (Mark 8:36) NKJV

When we as preachers stand before our congregations, we become, in some ways, the pilot of the plane or captain of the ship looking at the "souls" on board. What an awesome responsibility we have to "Preach the word; be prepared in season and out of season; correct, rebuke and encourage—with great patience and careful instruction." (II Timothy 4:2) As yet we do not know why flight 370 went off course. The captain of the Sewol did not give lifesaving instructions in time. For several nights now, in my mind, I have replayed the text message from a young soul, "Save us! We're on a ship and I think it's sinking." ★


y story really began when a man name Samuel Brandon, a Methodist volunteer song leader, one day said to his pastor, "We need a revival! The church seems to be dying!" The pastor agreed and called Rev. W.B. Welch, a radio preacher and pastor of First Church of the Nazarene in Charleston, South Carolina. My dad and mom, Sidney and Ora Murphy, and my older brother, Vaughn, got acquainted with Rev. Welch through that revival. My dad, who had backslidden from the Lord during WWII, now worked for the Army Corps of Engineers. His job transferred him to Charleston, South Carolina and mom insisted they go to church. When Dad pulled up to the First Church of the Nazarene, W.B. was coming out of the parsonage, saw them, and loved on them. From that point on, they became lifelong friends. Later that year, W.B. invited Mom and Dad to the Nazarene district campground for camp meeting. On July 4th, 1952, my dad was saved and was totally changed. Soon after his conversion, he felt called to become a pastor; he worked hard, completing both his GED and course of study. That year, 1959, Dad was ordained and he went on to pastor several churches in the Carolinas over the next 45 years. While Mom and Dad lived in Moncks Corner, South Carolina, my sister, Pam, and I were added to the family. Not knowing my destiny, my parents named me after the son of evangelists Dwight and Norma Jean Meredith.

It was in Greensboro, North Carolina that I began to appreciate music. I started playing piano at the age

of seven, and at 14, I was our church choir director while dad pastored Northside Church of the Nazarene. Being in a small church gave many opportunities to sing solos and duets, along with learning choir and other types of music. My mom was a stay-at-home mom and always encouraged me to pursue my music. In my early years, watching my mom and dad live out their Christian walk and being a part of those amazing church youth camps, directed by passionate leaders, was priceless to me.

I decided to go to Olivet Nazarene College (ONC) in 1973. In 1974, I became lead singer for the Churchmen,

a PR group for the school. Under the leadership of Dr.
Ted Lee, we traveled everywhere on ONC's educational zone singing in many churches, youth camps, and special



events. The quartet was very popular on the Olivet Zone during the 70s and eventually would be the catalyst to bring many revivals my way.

In 1975, Rev. Stephen Manley preached at the Illinois District youth camp at Nazarene Acres, where the Churchmen were leading the music. This wiry evangelist made statements like, "Jesus is in your red rosy lips. Jesus lives in you and can work through

you." My relationship with Christ had been in a "roller coaster" state. My heart was ready to hear that message and God filled me with his presence at that little camp. I felt the love of God like I had never felt it before. I fell in love with him so much I saturated my life in the Word, in prayer, and testimony. I could not believe how the preachers got better overnight. It's amazing how, when you fall in love with the Author of life, all things change.

In 1976, at Olivet, I met the most wonderful girl of my life—Julie Dixon from Muncie, Indiana. She also was in a traveling PR group for Olivet called the Treble Tone Trio. With a wonderful voice and a beautiful spirit, I fell




head-over-heels for her. Julie graduated in 1976 and became a registered nurse. I continued my education, and in 1977, my senior year, I married Julie. I ended up majoring in social work rather than music and minored in psychology,

but many music education experiences were already under my belt. My voice teacher, Dr. Gerald Greenlee, and Dr. Joseph Nielson were wonderful influences in my life during that time. The Churchman, Orpheus choir, and my private voice lessons helped me to use my voice for ministry. It was in 1976 at Eastern Michigan campground that I sensed a call on my life toward some kind of ministry, so I pursued my local minister's license.

My call specifically to evangelism:

After graduating in 1978, Julie and I headed to Kansas City to be ready to pursue seminary. But that December, I received a call from Dr. Leslie Parrot, then president of Olivet, asking me to be an Associate Director of Admissions. I accepted the invitation and we moved back to Olivet in '79.

Wisconsin and Michigan were my areas of responsibility. One weekend, after a PR tour in Michigan, my wife and I decided to stop at Lake Michigan to see the great sheets of ice that had formed on the lake. The Holy Spirit began to speak to me that he had something incredible for me, like the greatness of the ice. My heart was filled with joy, but then I looked down. There was a cliff between me and that amazing frozen lake. A cost would be involved. What was the Spirit saying to me?



In 1980, we had our first child, Marissa. In March of that year, my father invited me home to preach and sing at Northside. It was on a Saturday night while finalizing my music and message, I felt God's presence overwhelm me. I heard a voice confirming in my spirit: "This is what I want you to do for me! I want you to be my evangelist to preach and sing my message." I shouted and I wept and knew this was God's call on my life.

The Cost:

When Marissa was four months old, Julie took her to visit family in Muncie, Indiana. I was left alone in our little duplex in Bourbonnais, Illinois. I went into Marissa's bedroom, looked at the empty crib, and began to weep. The cost of leaving my family and being able support them began to be a reality. Earlier that month, I let Dr. Parrot and other important men in my life know I felt this call to evangelism. But at that time, I only had one revival scheduled for the fall. I would be the song evangelist for the Lincoln Church of the Nazarene in Lincoln, Illinois. Dr. Parrott wanted me to stay on at Olivet, but knew if I felt this call, I should set a date and make it happen. But how could I be an evangelist without any revivals? The word had to get out. I began to question my ability, but then the Holy Spirit reminded me of the scripture of Moses who complained about his inability to fulfill his call. God said to Moses, "Who made your mouth?" Then I was also reminded of Job. God said to Job, "If you're so wise tell me how this world came into existence?" Then Matthew 6:33-34: "Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness and all these things shall be added unto you." Then, I began to weep and sing the song of surrender: I surrender all! I surrender all!

Many years later, I was asked to sing at the General Assembly in Indianapolis. After practicing my song, I was coming off the platform when a gentleman came up to me and asked if I remembered singing at the Lincoln Nazarene church in Illinois twenty-five years before. I told him it was my first (continued on next page) revival as a full time evangelist. He said to me, "When you sang 'Broken Vessel' I answered the call to preach and have been true to that call ever since. I've wanted to tell you for many years." To God be the glory.

Then and now:

My evangelistic slate began to fill. God was and is faithful. I pursued the course of study, obtaining a district evangelist's license, and later I was ordained. After the third year in full-time ministry, I averaged a schedule of around 48 weeks a year with some bookings scheduled two to three years ahead. In that third year, Neil, our second child was born. It became evident we needed to travel as a family, so, we loaded up a trailer and headed off to revivals to continue the call.

Two of the greatest friends to evangelists are John and Diane Shoup. Pastor John Shoup of First Church of the Nazarene in Sturgis, Michigan, invited us to join in membership with this church and to make Sturgis our home base. For many years, and even to this day, they have given their support not only to our family, but to many other evangelist families. They have been such a blessing to many in traveling ministry.

After almost three years of being on the road with our family, our third child, Jessica, was born. Several months later, it seemed time the family stay at one place to ease the needs for schooling. Sturgis once again became a wonderful place of support. Julie began working as a nurse at the Sturgis Hospital and the Nazarene Church provided us a school and an apartment in which to live. I continued on my own, but with amazing home support.

God began to work in my life to write music and many wonderful opportunities were given to proclaim the good news because of a very special song, I AM NEAR. You can hear the story about that song on my website www.murphyministries.com

June 1, 2014 will begin my 28th year as a full time evangelist. I served six years as an associate pastor and minister of music, making 34 years of full-time ministry. Early in 2004, I went back into



evangelism full-time and the board of Muncie South Side Church in Muncie, Indiana, where I had been the associate pastor and minister of music, appointed me their Evangelist in Residence.

Today:

This year has started out as a trying year. After a colonoscopy (which everyone should have, especially if there is any history in your family of colon cancer or polyps) and subsequent surgery, to my disappointment I was found to have Stage III colon cancer. My mission statement has now become as follows: When you come to the potholes of life, you can either complain, be negative, or do nothing. OR you can fill those holes with the attitude of Christ to make the paths level so those who follow behind will not be tripped up. I choose to fill the holes with Christ. The healing power and God's will are all I need.

Our three adult children have married and brought Julie and me three wonderful grandchildren. I'm so proud of how our children are putting their trust in the Lord. Julie is an oncology nurse in Anderson, Indiana. We make our home with two black cats, Buddy and BJ in Selma, Indiana, Despite some setbacks due to the cancer treatment, as of the date of my

writing this article, I'm still busy holding many revivals, camp meetings, and evangelistic concerts. Over the years I have worked with some of the greatest evangelists in our church, as well as general and district leaders and pastors.

The rest of the Story:

Remember Samuel Brandon, the volunteer song

leader at that Methodist church who said to the pastor, "We need a revival! The church seems to be dying!" He was my mom's dad, my grandfather. Though I never met him (he died a year and half before I was born), that one statement sparked life for my dad, my family, and countless others who have been saved, sanctified, and renewed at our altars. In traveling thousands of miles and proclaiming the good news through music and the preached word to tens of thousands, I am humbled and yet honored to be called an evangelist.

I joined the Marine Corps on October 20, 1958 and served four years active duty and two years inactive

duty. I married the love of my life in November 1963 and received my discharge from the Corps in October 1964. In 1968, I surrendered everything to the Lord and accepted my call to preach. My wife and I, along with our two small children, moved to Colorado Springs, where I entered Nazarene Bible College. After Bible college, I accepted a call to Monett Church of the Nazarene in Missouri, where I pastored for sixteen years. Responding to God's call to full-time evangelism, I moved my family to Olathe, Kansas and entered the field of evangelism in September of 1987 and in 1994 became a tenured Nazarene evangelist.

During my ministry in Monett, I became involved with veterans groups and developed a special appreciation for WWI Marine veterans; I witnessed first-hand why this was truly "the greatest generation." I was introduced to Hal and we became friends. He made beautiful caps with the Marine Corps logo and the flag and the greeting of "Semper Fi."

Through the years of my travelling ministry, I would meet these old Marines and they would ask me about my cap. I would respond and ask them if they would like a cap like mine. They would always respond, "Yes" and ask where they could get one. I would say, "I'll give you one under one condition—that you let me pray with you and share the Gospel." Everyone who received this offer said, "Yes." What a great experience I had.

Of all the caps I gave away, one really stands out in my mind. I was walking the mall in Memphis, Tennessee. He was sitting in a wheel chair wearing an oxygen mask. He had an old worn-out cap that was dirty and frayed. I approached him and showed him my cap and asked him if he would like to have one like it; he said "Yes." When I shared that I would like to pray for him and tell him about Jesus, he said "Yes" and began to weep. When he got control of his emotions, he said he was ninety-two years old and no one had ever told him Jesus loved him or offered to pray for him. While we were rejoicing, his wife of seventy years came up to us. She asked him why he was crying and he responded, "I just gave my life to Jesus." I was then able to pray for her. Praise God for a \$20.00 cap! I expect to see him in heaven and under his crown will be a Marine Corps cap. *


wounds of broken relationships healed. What a joy to be able to witness such openness to the Spirit's work. Pastor Dennis Currell is being used by God in all new ways.

Humanity is not synonymous with carnality. The Bible does not teach that it is sinful to be human. God created man with a human nature and declared in Genesis 1:31 that everything He had made was very good. Before the fall in the garden, man was not only holy, but he was also human. Therefore, humanity is not tantamount to being sinful.

Paul tells us in Romans 5 that through Adam's disobedience all were made sinners. Therefore, sin is a foreign element inflicted upon human nature. The purpose of salvation is to cleanse man from all sin and restore him to the moral image of God. He does this first through regeneration (initial sanctification) that is the forgiveness of our own acts of transgression. However, this foreign element is, as G. N. Darby of the Plymouth Brethren says, "an infection of nature that doth remain in them that are regenerate." John calls this "the works of the devil" and admonishes us to continue to "walk in the light as He is in the light and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanses us from all sin." This is what the Apostle Paul prays for the Christians of Thessalonica that they be 'sanctified wholly.'

Sanctification removes nothing from our essential human nature but sin. We are not cleansed from self-consciousness, but self-centeredness, not from self-respect, but self-rule. We are very human with the same drives, appetites, impulses, and passions we had before we were sanctified wholly. We live in a sinful world that is no friend of grace to lead us on to God. We suffer with the scars of sin and Paul reminds us that "we have this treasure in earthen vessels." We, as Paul exemplified, must "keep under my body, and bring it into subjection." Wesley observed there is much growth following cleansing from sin by saying, "When the work is done, tis but begun." God's great plan of salvation does not de-humanize us but, instead, to coin a term, decarnalizes the human.

MOTORCYCLE EVANGELISM

At bike rallies, I give away free boot shines. Behind my Harley, I pull a small trailer with a portable shoeshine stand inside. Giving away free boot shines gives me a chance to meet new people and to get about 10-12 minutes to talk with them. Where else can I meet unsaved persons and have this kind of attention from them?

When I finish their boots, they generally want to pay me something. I refuse and make a counter offer; I tell them I would like to pray for them about any subject they want, any item on their mind. Few ever refuse prayer.

I had the opportunity of meeting and praying with a young man last weekend who works on an oil derrick out in the Gulf of Mexico. He was home for a few days around Easter and was at the rally with his wife and



four-year-old son, and with her mom and dad as well. He climbed up on my boot shine stand and I proceeded to work on his boots. When we finished, I got to pray over him, this father of a four-year-old boy. Putting my hands upon him, I prayed that God would help him be the kind of father the boy would need to grow up a Christian young man. I prayed he would prioritize religious things in his life so the boy would grow

up in a Christian home. I prayed he and his wife would find a church to would love on the boy and his mother while he was away in the gulf working.

There was some good preachin' in that prayer. In truth, I always attempt to preach a message in my prayer, and in doing, I attempt to plant seeds. Planting seeds is biblical, you know. "Some plant, some water; God gives the increase."

I subscribe to and am committed to practicing evangelism by the Engel Scale of Evangelism, defined by James Engel and Wilbert Norton in their book "What's Gone Wrong With the Harvest?" Engel highlights the various decisions a person makes when becoming a Christian. Everybody wants to be there when a new Christian is born. But there are lots of moments when someone moves from resentment toward church folk to tolerance of the idea of Christianity or from interest in Christianity to an awareness of a personal need. Ministry through the shoe shine stand takes people where they are and attempts to move them to a decision for Christ, even if it is only one step closer.

Remember, these were total strangers. Where else could I have had a moment like that with a total stranger? With their permission, I was actually able to put my hands on their shoulders and call out to God in a public setting to direct their life according to the truth of God. It is the modern day equivalent of sidewalk preaching, yet it is one-on-one. What an awesome experience.

Admittedly, I do not know if that young man has taken any of those points to heart. I just directly and simply prayed the truth. But the Holy Spirit can do quite a bit with Truth. And I know this too: were it not for a portable shoe shine stand, I would never have had the chance to pray for that young man/husband/father or the forty others whose boots I shined that day.

He came looking for a way to spend a Saturday and got a free boot shine. I went looking to shine boots and got to preach to and pray for a total stranger.

"Some plant, some water; God gives the increase." God be praised. ★


